The most vulnerable in our community feel the greatest impact and the weight of climate change. At the O'Neill Sea Odyssey, we have witnessed a growing wave of anxiety and fear regarding the state of our natural world. Providing students an opportunity to experience and observe the power, beauty, and importance of the ocean helps them develop a deeper connection to the natural world. Spending time in nature reduces "crisis fatigue" and helps students leave the program motivated to be part of the solution.

Environmental education is at the heart of the O'Neill Sea Odyssey (OSO). The OSO experience brings to life lessons from the classroom or online learning module. OSO provides real-time opportunities for students to apply the lessons they have learned in the field, in their own homes and communities. 

As a result, students report having an increased sense of connection and responsibility to our ocean and watersheds. They used their voices to organize beach and campus cleanups, develop PSA messages, perform food waste audits, and write letters to local representatives.
